Programming languages are *languages*!

"My name is Susan."

"Je m'appelle Susan."

Both sentences express the same concept but are structured differently. Both languages have parts of speech like subjects, objects, verbs and modifiers.

noun: person, place,
thing

variable: number,
string, boolean, array,
object

verb: action

function: task

Programming languages are **much** less ambiguous than natural languages

25	// digits	->	number
true	// true/false	->	boolean
"language"	// quotes	->	string
[1,2,3,4]	// brackets	->	array
{"dataType": "object"}	// braces	->	object
doSomething()	// parens	->	function

In the real world, things have names so we can tell them apart. We do the same thing in programming.

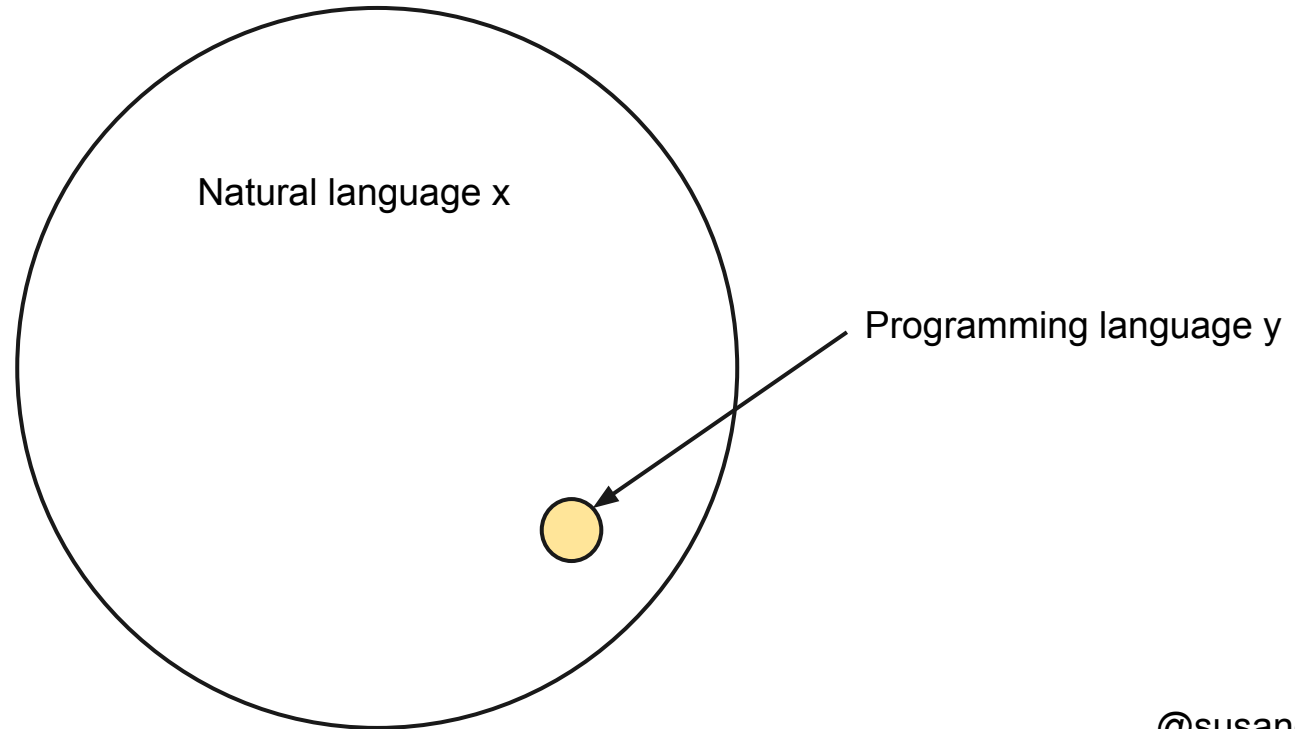
